

What is eNTRI?

Electronic Travel Registration & Information (eNTRI) is an online registration facility provided by the Government of Malaysia to facilitate the entrance of PRC nationals residing in Mainland China into Malaysia under the Visa Waiver Programme. An eNTRI Note will be issued as proof of the registration and is required to be presented upon arrival in Malaysia.

Who can apply for eNTRI?

All PRC nationality from **China Mainland ONLY** excluding Hong Kong, Macau and Taiwan.

How long can I stay with eNTRI?

An eNTRI holder is entitled to **maximum of 15 days** for each visit. Each application can only be used once. **No extension is allowed.**

How do I get started?

- For first time applicant, you are required to "I'm New" to start your application process.
- For existing applicant, you have "Returning User" to your account.

What are the terms and conditions for eNTRI?

- Upon completion of registration, applicants are required to print out the eNTRI Note, which must be presented upon arrival in Malaysia.
- eNTRI facility are available from **January 1st, 2017 until December 31st 2017 for all PRC nationals from Mainland China ONLY** excluding Hong Kong, Macau and Taiwan.
- Applicants with **direct flights from Mainland China to Malaysia** via the following options:

By land

1. Sultan Iskandar Building Immigration Checkpoint, Johor
2. Sultan Abu Bakar Checkpoint, Johor
3. Padang Besar Checkpoint, Perlis
4. Bukit Kayu Hitam Checkpoint, Kedah
5. Sungai Tujoh Immigration Checkpoint, Sarawak
6. Tedungan Immigration Checkpoint, Sarawak

Applicants with direct flights or transit from Singapore, Thailand or Brunei to Malaysia via the following options:

By air

2. Penang International Airport, Pulau Pinang
3. Langkawi International Airport, Kedah
4. Melaka International Airport, Melaka
5. Senai International Airport, Johor

9. Labuan International Airport, Sabah

By land

1. Sultan Iskandar Building Immigration Checkpoint, Johor
 2. Sultan Abu Bakar Checkpoint, Johor
 3. Padang Besar Checkpoint, Perlis
 4. Bukit Kayu Hitam Checkpoint, Kedah
 5. Sungai Tujuh Immigration Checkpoint, Sarawak
 6. Tedungan Immigration Checkpoint, Sarawak
- Applicants with flights other than the above options and departing from Hong Kong, Macau, Taiwan or others country into Malaysia is not permitted.
 - All applicants are only permitted to return from Malaysia via direct flight to Mainland China or transit flight through Singapore, Thailand or Brunei only.

What are the documents needed upon arrival at Malaysian entry checkpoints?

This following documents are required to be presented upon arrival in Malaysia entry checkpoints:

- eNTRI printout
- Boarding pass
- Sufficient funds (Cash/Debit or Credit Cards with Union Pay logo / Travellers Cheque)
- Confirmed returned flight ticketst
