What is eNTRI?

Electronic Travel Registration & Information (eNTRI) is an online registration facility provided by the Government of Malaysia to facilitate the entrance of PRC passport holder tourists who are residing in People's Republic of China (including Hong Kong and Macau) into Malaysia under the Visa Waiver Programme. An eNTRI Note will be issued as proof of the registration and is required to be presented upon arrival in Malaysia.

Who can apply for eNTRI?

PRC passport holder tourists who are residing in People's Republic of China (including Hong Kong and Macau).

How long can I stay with eNTRI?

An eNTRI holder is entitled to maximum of 15 days for each visit. Each application can only be used once. **No extension is allowed.**

How do I get started?

- For first time applicant, you are required to **"I'm New"** to start your application process.
- For existing applicant, you have **"Returning User"** to your account.

What are the terms and conditions for eNTRI?

- Upon completion of registration, applicants are required to **print out the eNTRI Note**, which must be presented upon arrival in Malaysia.
- eNTRI facility are available from **1st January 2020 until 31st December 2020** for all PRC passport holder tourists who are residing in People's Republic of China (including Hong Kong and Macau).

Applicants with direct flight from People's Republic of China (including Hong Kong and Macau) OR via Singapore, Thailand or Brunei may enter Malaysia through the following entry options:

By Air

All authorized Malaysian air entry and exit points by Department of Immigration, Malaysia.

By land

1. Sultan Iskandar Building Immigration Checkpoint, Johor
2. Sultan Abu Bakar Checkpoint, Johor
3. Johor Bahru Railway Station, Johor
4. Padang Besar Checkpoint, Perlis
5. Bukit Kayu Itam Checkpoint, Kedah
6. Sungai Tujoh Immigration Checkpoint, Sarawak
7. Tedungan Immigration Checkpoint, Sarawak

All applicants **are permitted** to return from Malaysia via a direct flight to People's Republic of China (including Hong Kong and Macau) **OR** via Singapore, Thailand or Brunei **OR** to any countries if travelling by air through the following exit points:

By air

All authorized Malaysian air entry and exit points by Department of Immigration, Malaysia.

By land

1. Sultan Iskandar Building Immigration Checkpoint, Johor
2. Sultan Abu Bakar Checkpoint, Johor
3. Johor Bahru Railway Station, Johor
4. Padang Besar Checkpoint, Perlis
5. Bukit Kayu Itam Checkpoint, Kedah
6. Sungai Tujoh Immigration Checkpoint, Sarawak
7. Tedungan Immigration Checkpoint, Sarawak

Applicants with flights from Taiwan and other than the above options and departing from other countries into Malaysia are NOT PERMITTED.

What are the documents needed upon arrival at Malaysian entry checkpoints?

These following documents are required to be presented upon arrival in Malaysia entry checkpoints:

1. eNTRI Note
2. Boarding Pass
3. Confirmed tickets coming in and leaving Malaysia
4. Sufficient funds (Cash/Debit or credible Credit Cards such as UnionPay /Travellers Cheque/ eMoney such as Alipay)
5. Complete travel itinerary
6. Proof of residence in Malaysia (optional)
